
The Mercy Mission House Emergency Shelter

It is amazing that Will is still smiling.

Born in VA. He was only 12 years old when his mother was holding him watching a movie and shot herself. He has damaged hearing in his right ear from the gunshot sound. He was in foster care. He went to live with his Dad and witnessed two of his older brothers die from gang violence. At just 16, he was at the community pool with his younger siblings who were in the stroller. Will went to buy them all ice cream and a group of boys that were tossing a football around knocked the stroller into the pool. Both siblings drowned and died. Will still blames himself. He is the only one in his family that has graduated from High School. Will is working hard in our program so he can take care of his 9 month old daughter.




Tiho, 18

Born in Sofia City, Bulgaria. Tiho was adopted by an Auglaize County, Ohio family when he was 9. He and his biological sister moved to the US. His sister was older and was kicked out of the house when she was 17. When Tiho was 15, his adopted father beat him with a belt so badly he couldn't sit down. The school counselors called the police who had to visit the home. Tiho did not like his adoptive parents. They told him he had anger issues, ADHD and learning problems. About a week after Tiho turned 18, he came home from track practice and was told to get in the car. They dropped him off at Mercy Mission House. Tiho will be a senior in high school next year. He plans to be a welder after graduation. While at MMH, Tiho was respectful, calm, polite and helpful. MMH connected Tiho to needed services. We are happy to share that one of our Board Members invited Tiho to live with their family. Tiho will be missed!

He became suicidal and tried to light his mattress on fire just to escape his life in the room. Jack struggles with mental health issues and has been in and out of treatment facilities; and also prison. Jack says the system has shuffled him around and he started using the system because it was all he knew. He was homeless throughout the pandemic which he shared was an extremely difficult time. He began using meth. He is trying to stay clean. He is not in our shelter at this time due to breaking rules. Please pray for Jack. Jack is very creative, he picks up trash and makes art.

She is one sassy survivor with sarcasm unparalleled.

Born in Dallas, TX to a mother who was addicted to speed. April grew up in the country with a military stepdad. She challenged his authority and everyone else's. She was abused at her small town school and was constantly made fun of and bullied. Her grandmother was her savior. She got kicked out at 18 years old and moved in with her alcoholic father. He "hardcore physically abused" her, but also let her do whatever she wanted. She dated a man for 10 years who left her 2 months before their wedding. Her world fell apart. She met someone who helped her pick herself back up, but he also scared her. She lived with him in an RV and one day, driving home from work April had a massive stroke. She woke up in the hospital and was told she would never walk again. Not April. She walked slowly out of that hospital 3 months later. Her family sold her RV when she was unconscious after the stroke. She walked out of the hospital and found herself homeless. She moved in with her boyfriend and his cousin. She entered into rehab to stop the meth she started to self-medicate with. She completed rehab. She fell at home and her boyfriend beat her badly. The ambulance took her to a nursing home, and she completed PT.

She was once again homeless when she was discharged and came to MMH.

MMH was helping her get her disability benefits and back home to Texas.

He had 2 boys and a girl. He and his partner let the kids decide who to live with when they split up. His son Mike lives with him. Mike is autistic. Melvin's greatest joy was when Mike graduated from the MR program at Sidney High School. Melvin had surgery in March and had to be off work for two months. His friend promised to move in and help with the bills during his recovery but he didn't. Melvin and Mike got evicted for not being able to pay their bills. They came to MMH temporarily. Melvin works almost 7 days a week. MMH connected them with wrap around services and helped them find a new place.

They were in shelter for less than 4 weeks.

Ryan is developmentally delayed and lived in a group home at one time. Unfortunately, his father called the police repeatedly to the house and scared the other residents. Ryan is very loving and helpful. Ryan loves being at the shelter with his two "moms" and his friends. He feels safe with the staff. We have worked to get him a payee. We ask for your prayers as Ryan recently decided to move into a home in Piqua with his girlfriend. We will miss him and hope he is safe and happy.

Her grandfather had been molesting her since age 12 until she moved out. Stephany never had a chance to get to know her mom, her mother died very young from kidney failure. Stephany did a DNA test and found out that her grandfather is her biological father. She assumes he must have molested her mother too.

Stephany has been through a lot. Two failed marriages, nine kids, two miscarriages, many interactions with the law from driving without a license to other misdemeanors. She saw a lot of things growing up and feels her life is a mystery and that she is still searching for truth.

Kristy, 53


The joyful jokester


Raphael, 23

He and his girlfriend were in sober living but she got kicked out and he followed her. They have a 5-month-old daughter. While he knows his daughter's mom and he are not good together, he hopes to be in his daughter's life one day. Raphael said after finding Mercy Mission House, he finally feels like he is in a place where he can succeed.

He has worked at several area industrial factories as a forklift driver. Unfortunately, Todd has been let go from 8 different places due to having a seizure at work and safety concerns. He doesn't want to go on disability, he feels like he is too young, and he wants to work to make a living. Todd recently got pulled over without insurance. The fines, court fees and cost of insurance wiped out his bank account.

Taking a moment to heal



She couldn't walk at her high school graduation because she was pregnant with her son. She was married but her husband abused her in every way imaginable - physical, emotional, verbal. One day she finally left and went to New Choices shelter after he had beaten her. She felt shame because she couldn't be there for her children. She wanted to leave and find a place to stay but didn't trust anyone. Her sister told her about Mercy Mission House, and she wanted to see if it was a place she could feel safe and stay for a while.

MMH is giving her a steppingstone toward her healing journey.

Finding security and success together



He couldn't pay rent and became homeless again and came to the Mercy Mission House.

He continued to work as a property manager and then a sculptor. While in Philadelphia, he met a lovely woman. They began dating. Both of them struggled with alcohol misuse. Their relationship was intense, and she became abusive. The scar on his eye is from a broken bottle she hit him with before she burnt down their apartment. He found himself homeless and moved back to Ohio. He eventually found a job working at a theater in TX, but the lovely woman began writing him when she was in jail. He eventually moved to be closer to her again. They had a child, but the relationship was still unstable. They separated. His alcohol misuse got worse. He got a DUI and couldn't pick up his daughter. He moved back to Ohio.

MMH was able to help him find employment and resources for his own apartment.

He says he sometimes feels hopeless but remembers being on the operating table and hearing a voice say, "it's not your time." He believes that voice was God and Jason is still here because God has a purpose for his life.

Jason fell into substance misuse and has been working hard at recovery and tries to stay clean. He falters sometimes but admits it and wants to be clean. MMH is working with Jason to get his disability benefits and consistent sobriety.

He got his GED and moved to Florida where he worked as a brick layer for Disney. He came home from work one day and found someone raping his wife. He killed them. He went to prison for 7 years. He came back to Ohio after prison, got remarried and supported his family by working at Wagner Manufacturing for 14 years. When he lost his job, he got divorced, his mother died and he felt completely alone. He was homeless until the shelter opened and he found himself once again living on Children's Home Road. MMH helped him get his social security payments and found him permanent housing. We are proud of the progress Doyle made while in our program.

She met the father of her first son at 21. While she was pregnant, she lived with her uncle who was an alcoholic. Chelsea woke up as he was trying to come after her with an army knife to cut out the baby. She lived with her mom off and on who choked her and told her she was "a disease" that would ruin her kids and family. She got into an altercation with her son and was arrested. She is working hard to heal from the many struggles in her life. She has nightmares and flashbacks. She said she likes MMH and feels very safe here. MMH is working with FRC and her payee to help her on her journey.

He lived in a half-way house after he got out for a while. He did good and when he got back home to Sidney, he was around a lot of drug use. Mike started doing meth and he just couldn't stop. He ended up back in prison until recently. His son brought him to MMH. Mike said "so far I really like it here. I am working on following the rules and staying out of trouble."

MMH connected her with case management services at FRC. She is on a fixed income and MMH is helping her connect with other services in hopes of getting permanent housing.

Sometimes you just have to laugh and Bryan will help with that


Bryan was born in Ohio. He grew up with his mom and younger sister. They were often worried about when and if they would get to eat. They moved around a lot.

Born in Sidney, Ohio. Cathy moved a lot when she was younger. Her mother was married 8 times. At age 3, her grandfather started sexually molesting her. When she was just 16, her grandfather asked her to do sexual favors with his friends for money and he would pay her. She said no and left home at 16. She got married and pregnant right away and had to quit high school. She moved around to various states with her husband for over 6 years looking for work. By age 21, she and her husband had 3 children. At 22, she got divorced. Her husband took her kids. She saved enough money for a bus ticket to move closer to her kids. She was caught in Hurricane Hugo but survived. She believes her grandmother's prayers saved her. She met her next husband and they lived in 5 different states. She has been back in Sidney for 5 years, living with her sister. Her sister has a controlling boyfriend and Cathy wasn't allowed to have friends over, no pets even though she paid rent monthly. She worked at Honda and then Norcold. She met a man at her work and he lied to her and used her. He started dating another co-worker and it was too much for her and she quit. She is working to get a job. She does not want to be in another controlling situation and plans to live on her own.
